Jeanie Clarke visited Beulah Primary School again last week to conduct her second pulses sessions. This time, students viewed, under a microscope, seeds that had started to sprout. They discussed what a seed requires to germinate and what happens to seed as it grows. Students finished the session by planting their own 'paddock' of field peas. The students have been provided with a year's worth of water, equivalent to the average rainfall in the Wimmera, and are responsible for the care of their peas over the next 4 weeks. We look forward to watching our peas grow.
